

CITC HISTORY

The ACT Regional Building and Construction Industry Training Council Inc. (CITC) was established in October 1988 as a 'Not for Profit' Organisation.

Its Key objectives include:

To improve, promote and facilitate training, tuition, courses, seminars and workshops for improving the knowledge, efficiency and skills set out above and for these purposes to prepare, publish and disseminate publications about any training assistance that is available.

To improve, promote and facilitate surveys to identify the training and manpower needs of the industry and in the development and implementation of policies, plans and programs to meet these needs.

To promote to the industry the importance and benefits of systematic training, job satisfaction and personal development.

To ensure liaison with educational, professional and training bodies whether governmental or otherwise to further these objectives and to obtain and use specialist advice as may be necessary.

To promote, undertake or grant assistance in the interchange of training information and of programs between those engaged in the industry either within Australia or overseas.

The Council comprises 22 members from which a nine (9) member Executive is elected.

Members represent four (4) main constituencies:

Employer Organisations and Employers

Employee Organisations and Employees

Government

Registered Training Organisations

As an Incorporated Body it is governed by Association Rules and is required to comply with all relevant regulatory requirements.
